In that sense, Our Lady of Lourdes junior high students began writing a new chapter for our school at the MATHCOUNTS Regional competition hosted by Millikin University on Feb. 11.

The MATHCOUNTS Competition Series is a national program that provides students the opportunity to compete in live, inperson contests against and alongside their peers. Created in 1983, it is the longest-running MATHCOUNTS program and is open to all sixth-, seventh- and eighthgrade students.

Taking some time out of their Saturday, eight students from OLOL competed at this event for the first time.

Junior high math teacher Mr. Bryan Kenney said all students were welcome to try out for the team. They took a test to determine the top four and four alternates, and two others also practiced after school lems to be prepared for." to get ready.
